TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF INTERSECTION: FIFTH ROAD AND NANGOLO MBUMBA DRIVE

Construction of New Rising main to New Pump Station

DESCRIPTION OF THE WORKS

The intersection of Fifth Road and Nangolo Mbumba Drive along with a portion of Fifth Road, will be closed off to allow for the installation new rising main. Residents are advised to please take note of the section of the road that will be closed during this project, as indicated in the locality maps below.

All affected residents and road users are requested to strictly adhere to the traffic signage and speed restrictions around the indicated area.

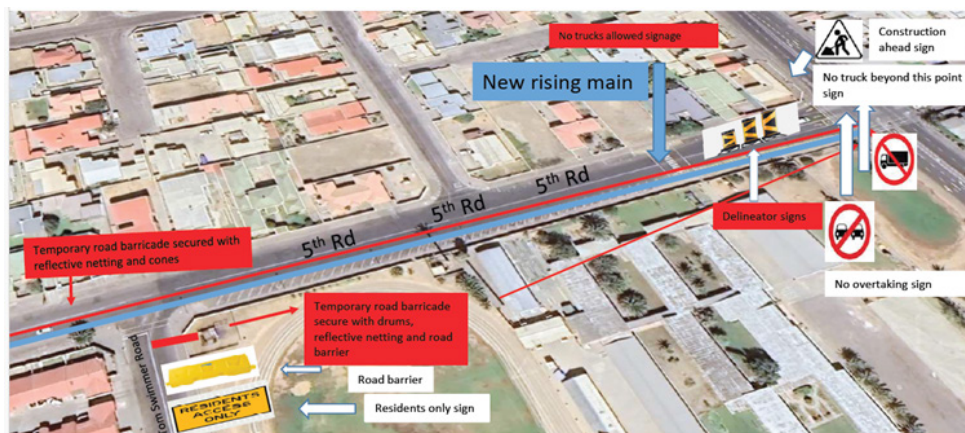
Light vehicles will still be able to use Fifth Road. Tom Swemmer Street and Peter Mueshange Street will be temporarily closed at the intersection to Fifth Road. A detour shall be provided at the corner of Union Street and Fifth Road

Heavy vehicles from the border and the salt works will be diverted as follows: **(New arrangement)**

- Loaded trucks from WBSH will make use of Kovambo Nujoma via The Esplanade via Sam Nujoma via Fifth Road to the harbour.
- Empty trucks from Port will make use of Fifth road via Paul Vincent or Peter Dixon via The Esplanade via Kowambo Nujoma and back to WBSH for loading
